

# Quick Reference Guide for Physicians

## 1 REPORT RESULTS

Hearing screening and test results should be reported for all screenings (pass and did not pass) and diagnostic testing (normal or diagnosis) one of two ways:

- Reported online in OZ eSP (tehdi.com) or
- Reported on paper and faxed to OZ Systems 817-385-3939

**Note:** Please include birth name, current name, Medicaid #, DOB, gender, mother's maiden name, current contact information, and second point of contact on all entries so records can be matched.

## 2 REFER TO ECI

Refer to ECI within 7 days when:

- Baby did not pass outpatient re-screen
- Baby diagnosed hard of hearing or deaf

**Note:** Please include birth name, current name, current contact information, and second point of contact on all entries. This enables proper matching of records. Referrals should be reported directly through the OZ eSP TEHDI site (tehdi.com) or by fax/phone (817-385-3939). **Early Childhood Intervention (ECI)** is a statewide program administered by the Texas Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services for families and children (ages birth-3) with disabilities and developmental delays. ECI supports families to help their children reach their potential through developmental services provided by a variety of local agencies and organizations across Texas.
