# **Major Accomplishments**

• Quarantine period guidance update - Language added to scripts to emphasize 14-day quarantine period recommendation from DSHS. The Self-Report flow, Positive Lab Case flow, Exposed Contact flow have all been updated with this messaging. Message is as follows:

"We recommend quarantining for 14 days because this option has the lowest risk of transmission. We recognize there is varying guidance for self-quarantining safely. If you have questions about modified quarantine guidance, please reach out to your local health department."

- Manual case level deduplication now available using the Merge Cases button. Users with permission to delete cases can utilize this feature.
- LHA cases excluded from Call Center assignment Functionality has been enabled to excluding cases from the call center that should be investigated by a Local Health Authority (LHA). At this time, this is available for <u>cases</u> based on <u>county</u> only.
- New line list and report filters Mailing city and loss of smell are now available as filters in line lists and reports.
- Backlog of ELR cases imported into THT from NEDSS. Importing at a rate of ~10,000 labs per day, distributed proportionally across jurisdictions, during the time period of 12/11/20-12/24/20.
- Lab Source type for manually entered labs Cases with manually added labs will be processed upon record creation, eliminating the need for a wait period for correct script to update. Script looping for cases with manually entered labs should be resolved as a result of this fix, as well.
- Probable case classification Abdominal Pain was removed as a TIER 2 symptom for clinical criteria. Case classification will not consider abdominal pain as a clinical criterion for meeting probable case classification.
- Transferring information for EC to Case conversion Date of test is now mapped from the Exposed Contact to the Case when promoting an Exposed Contact to a Case.
- Updated jurisdiction mapping for key RLHEs.

### **Open Issues**

• Jurisdiction assignment is still experiencing issues based on address information. Continue to report new issues to your THT team lead.

# Plans for Next Sprint Cycle

- Update Exposed Contact form and guided workflow to collect vaccination information.
- Enable prioritization of cases being assigned to call center staff when they are assigned out of the queue. Most urgent cases will be assigned before lower priority cases.
- Create city option in THT Local Heath Jurisdiction profile for LHA's with city jurisdictions who wish to perform Contact Tracing and Case Investigation.
- Change the following fields to be required: Symptom onset date (when "Have you ever had symptoms for COVID-19?" = "Yes"); all fields in "Period of Potential Exposure" on the Exposed Contact form.
- New escalation category and queue to allow duplicate cases to be escalated to a user with necessary permission to review and complete case merges.



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
